Celebrate entrepreneurship with this beautifully photographed coffee-table book about the glories and characters of Main Street.

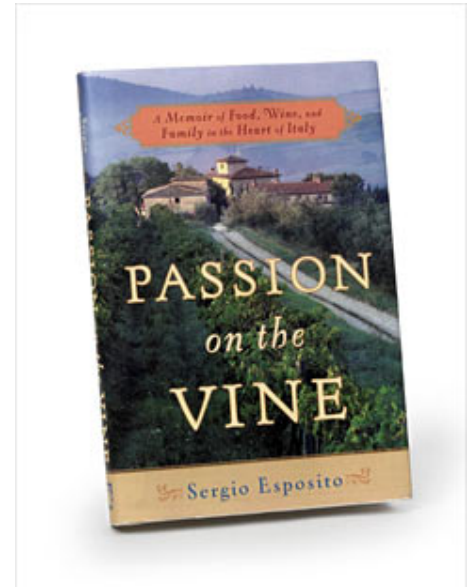


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
